Tossed from a Moving Car, Dog Survives to Find a Better Life

Rescued by a Good Samaritan and brought to the SPCA of Westchester



While caring for the animals at the SPCA of Westchester, we are often reminded of the Yin and Yang of life. Although there are those who neglect, mistreat and abuse animals, we are grateful for the many others that respect, protect and care about companion animals. Luckily, a Good Samaritan was nearby the day that

Troy, a young mixed-breed dog, was thrown out of the window of a moving car. She carefully bundled the hurt dog in a blanket and drove him to the SPCA for help.

"Amazingly, Troy's injuries were not serious, other than a broken toe, which was surgically corrected," said Shannon Laukhuf, Executive Director of the SPCA. "However, there was evidence of neglect — an ear infection, Lyme disease that was left untreated and, understandably, fearful anxiety." After being neutered and treated by our veterinary team, our behavior and enrichment coordinator evaluated Troy and put together a behavior modification plan just for him. The plan included anxiety medication, sleeping in the trainer's office for awhile, positive reinforcement and a whole lot of love.

Erin and Jim Butrick were married this past July. They bought a house and, being ardent dog lovers, knew that their home would not be complete without one. A visit to the SPCA resulted in love at first site when they met Troy. The dog that went home with the Butricks was not the same animal that had arrived at the shelter months earlier. And now, after experiencing the joys of a loving home, Guinness' (Troy's new name) transformation of



shelter dog to family member is complete. He has lost his fear of veterinarians, no longer reacts aggressively with other dogs and embraces new adventures with his family.

"The one thing I would really like people to know is how lovable and wonderful a pit bull can be. Guinness loves laying around with us and follows us wherever we go."

- Found forever homes for 1,319 cats and dogs, plus 19 birds, ferrets and reptiles
- Rescued 591 puppies and young adult dogs and 28 cats from highkill shelters
- Reunited 136 lost dogs and cats to their relieved and grateful families
- Altered 747 cats and dogs through our Simpson Spay/Neuter Clinic
- Fixed 617 feral cats through our TNR (Trap, Neuter, Release) Program
- Treated 1,584 furry patients through our Clinic's community wellness program
- Received 1,653 calls through our Confidential Animal Cruelty Hotline
- Investigated 820 cases of cruelty through our Humane Law Enforcement (HLE) Unit
- Removed 65 animals from harm's way
- Welcomed more than 400 volunteers who donated nearly 30,000 hours of their time
- Visited 65 healthcare facilities dispensing joy through our Golden Outreach Pet Therapy


Shopping Event Goes to the Dogs
